CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT THE CRIMINAL OFFENCE OF DIRECTLY OR INDIRECTLY INFLUENCING THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS TO OBTAIN AN UNFAIR ADVANTAGE IN THE AWARD OF A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT, contrary to section 23(1) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29) and section 92(2)(b) of the Public Procurement Act, 2003 (Act 663).

(1) KENNETH NANA YAW OFORI-ATTA, 66 years, in your position as the Minister of Finance; (2) EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Acting Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority; (3) EVANS ADUSEI, 62 years, beneficial owner, Chief Executive and controlling mind of Strategic



Mobilisation Enhancement Limited; and (4) STRATEGIC MOBILISATION GHANA LIMITED formerly known as Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited - between June and September 2017 - at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, agreed to act together with a common purpose to commit the criminal offence of directly or indirectly influencing the procurement process to obtain an unfair advantage in the award of a procurement contract for enhanced classification, valuation and risk management in the context of the payment of duties and levies on imported goods to Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited, which was incorporated on 14 February 2017, through the single-source method by wilfully misrepresenting to Public Procurement Authority that Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited had particular interest in providing effective and measurable solutions for the enhancement of government revenue and that it enjoyed financial and technological backing from its investors and that one of its investors COTECNA S.A. (a multinational company), would provide, implement and maintain a comprehensive information technology platform and further that COTECNA S.A. had given Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited ownership of its proprietary technology.

COUNT TWO STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

ATTEMPT TO COMMIT THE CRIMINAL OFFENCE OF INFLUENCING THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS TO OBTAIN AN UNFAIR ADVANTAGE IN THE AWARD OF A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT, contrary to section 18(2) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29) and section 92(2)(b) of the Public Procurement Act, 2003 (Act 663).

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Acting Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority – in June 2017 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, attempted to commit the criminal offence of influencing the procurement process to obtain an unfair advantage in the award of a procurement contract for enhanced classification, valuation and risk management in the context of the payment of duties and levies on imported goods to Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited, which was incorporated on 14 February 2017, through the single-source method by wilfully misrepresenting to Public Procurement Authority that Strategic Mobilisation



Enhancement Limited had particular interest in providing effective and measurable solutions for the enhancement of government revenue and that it enjoyed financial and technological backing from its investors and that one of its investors COTECNA S.A. (a multinational company), would provide, implement and maintain a comprehensive information technology platform and further that COTECNA S.A. had given Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited ownership of its proprietary technology.

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority – in June 2018 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, directly influenced the procurement process to obtain an unfair advantage to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited by awarding Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited, on behalf of Ghana Revenue Authority, a procurement contract of transaction audit services, through the single-source method, without the mandatory statutory prior approval of the Board of Public Procurement Authority.

COUNT FIVE STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT THE CRIMINAL OFFENCE OF CAUSING FINANCIAL LOSS TO THE REPUBLIC contrary to sections 23(1) and 179A(3)(a) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29).

(1) KENNETH NANA YAW OFORI-ATTA, 66 years, in your position as the Minister of Finance; (2) EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority; (3) ISAAC CRENTSIL, 63 years, in your position as the Commissioner of the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority; (4) EVANS ADUSEI, 62 years, beneficial owner, Chief Executive and controlling mind of Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited; and (5) STRATEGIC MOBILISATION GHANA LIMITED – between June 2018 and December 2018 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, agreed to act together with a common purpose of committing the crime of causing financial loss to the Republic to cause Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to be put on an automatic payment mode and to cause Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to receive the sum of Eighteen Million Five Hundred and Fifty-Six Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety Cedis Twenty-Eight (GH¢18,556,390.28) as payment for purported transaction audit services without validation and evidence of performance, and without actual performance of the purported transaction audit services under a transaction audit services contract



unlawfully awarded by Ghana Revenue Authority to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited in June 2018, through the single-source method, without the mandatory statutory prior approval by the Board of Public Procurement Authority.

ISAAC CRENTSIL, 63 years – between June and December 2018 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, while holding office as the Commissioner of the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority, corruptly abused your public office for private profit or benefit by causing Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to be put on an automatic payment mode and causing Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to receive the sum of Eighteen Million Five Hundred and Fifty-Six Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety Cedis Twenty-Eight Pesewas (GH¢18,556,390.28) as payment for purported transaction audit services under a transaction audit services contract which you knew or ought to have known was unlawfully awarded by Ghana Revenue Authority to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited in June 2018, through the single-source method, without the mandatory

(1) KENNETH NANA YAW OFORI-ATTA, 66 years, in your position as the Minister of Finance; (2) EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority; and (3) ISAAC CRENTSIL, 63 years, in your position as Commissioner of the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority – between February 2018 and June 2018 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, agreed to act together with a common purpose of committing the crime of wilful oppression in respect of the duties of your offices by wilfully committing excess of authority to the injury of the public by disregarding the disapproval by Public Procurement Authority of Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited (which was rebranded to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited) for a procurement contract for revenue assurance; by awarding a procurement contract of revenue assurance of transaction audit services to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited without the prior approval of the Board of Public Procurement Authority.

COUNT THIRTEEN STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

WILFUL OPPRESSION contrary to section 239(1) & (3) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29) as amended by section 1 of the Criminal Offences (Amendment) Act, 2020 (Act 1034).



PARTICULARS OF OFFENCE

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority – between June 2018 and December 2018 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, committed the crime of wilful oppression in respect of the duties of your office by wilfully committing excess of authority by disregarding the disapproval by Public Procurement Authority of Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited (which was rebranded to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited) for a procurement contract; by awarding Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited a procurement contract of transaction audit services, through the single-source method, on behalf of Ghana Revenue Authority without the mandatory statutory prior approval of the Board of Public Procurement Authority and thereby causing Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to receive the sum of Eighteen Million Five Hundred and Fifty-Six Thousand Three Hundred and Ninety Cedis Twenty-Eight Pesewas (GH¢18,556,390.28) as payment for purported transaction audit services to the injury of the public.

COUNT FOURTEEN STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

DIRECTLY INFLUENCING THE PROCUREMENT PROCESS TO OBTAIN AN UNFAIR ADVANTAGE IN THE AWARD OF A PROCUREMENT CONTRACT, contrary to section 92(2)(b) of the Public Procurement Act, 2003 (Act 663).

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years, in your position as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority – in June 2018 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, directly influenced the procurement process to obtain an unfair advantage to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited by awarding Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited a procurement contract of External Price Verification Services on behalf of Ghana Revenue Authority, through the single-source method, without the mandatory statutory prior approval of the Board of Public Procurement Authority – and at a time when you knew or ought to have known that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited lacked the technical capacity and expertise to execute external price verification services.



COUNT FIFTEEN STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

USING PUBLIC OFFICE FOR PROFIT, contrary to section 179C(a) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29).

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years – between January 2018 and March 2019 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, while holding office as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority, corruptly abused your public office for private profit or benefit by causing Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to be put on an automatic payment mode and causing Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited to receive the sum of Fifteen Million Nine Hundred and Thirty-Eight Thousand Cedis Two Hundred and Fifty-Four Cedis Fifty-Five Pesewas (GH¢15,938,254.55) as payment for purported External Price Verification Services Pilot contract which you knew or ought to have known was unlawfully awarded by Ghana Revenue Authority to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited in June 2018, through the single-source method, without the mandatory statutory prior approval by the Board of Public Procurement Authority, and at a time when you knew or ought to have known that the payment was made without validation and evidence of performance, and that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited did not execute the purported external price verification services, and also that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited lacked the technical capacity and expertise to execute the services.

PARTICULARS OF OFFENCE

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years – on or around 17 April 2019 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, while holding office as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority and being a public officer authorised to certify payments due from Ghana Revenue Authority, certified the payment of the sum of Ten Million Nine Hundred and Thirty-Eight Thousand Seventeen Cedis Eighty-Two Pesewas (GH¢10,938,017.82) to

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Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited for purported external price verification pilot services without having reason to believe that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited had performed the purported services according to your certification at a time when you knew or ought to have known that the payment was made without validation and evidence of performance, and that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited did not execute the purported external price verification services, and also that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited lacked the technical capacity and expertise to execute the services.

COUNT SEVENTEEN STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

FALSE CERTIFICATE BY PUBLIC OFFICER contrary to sections 249(1)(b) and (2) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29) as amended by section 3 of the Criminal Offences (Amendment) Act, 2020 (Act 1034).

PARTICULARS OF OFFENCE

EMMANUEL KOFI NTI, 66 years – on or around 8 May 2019 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, while holding office as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority and being a public officer authorised to certify payments due from Ghana Revenue Authority, certified the payment of the sum of Five Million Two Hundred and Thirty-Six Cedis Seventy-Three Pesewas (GH¢5,000,236.73) to Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited for purported external price verification pilot services without having reason to believe that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited had performed the purported services according to your certification at a time when you knew or ought to have known that the payment was made without validation and evidence of performance, and that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited did not execute the purported external price verification services, and also that Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited lacked the technical capacity and expertise to execute the services.

COUNT EIGHTEEN STATEMENT OF OFFENCE

CONSPIRACY TO COMMIT THE CRIMINAL OFFENCE OF CAUSING FINANCIAL LOSS TO THE REPUBLIC contrary to sections 23(1) and 179A(3)(a) of the Criminal Offences Act, 1960 (Act 29).

KENNETH NANA YAW OFORI-ATTA, 66 years, in your position as the Minister of Finance – in October 2023 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, entered into an agreement on behalf of the Government of Ghana through the Ministry of Finance for consolidation of revenue assurance services with a financial commitment that binds the Government for more than one financial year to the benefit of Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited for



a period of an initial five(5) years at a service fee of US\$0.75 per barrel of petroleum products per month and 0.75% of the total volume value of mineral resources monitored by Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited totaling an estimated Two Billion Seven Hundred and Ninety-Nine Million Six Hundred and Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Four United States Dollars Seventy-One Cents (US\$2,799,604,864.71) without the mandatory statutory prior authorisation by Parliament.

ENTERING INTO AN AGREEMENT WITH A FINANCIAL COMMITMENT THAT BINDS THE GOVERNMENT FOR MORE THAN ONE FINANCIAL YEAR WITHOUT PRIOR AUTHORISATION BY PARLIAMENT, contrary to sections 33(1)(b) and 98(1)(d) of the Public Financial Management Act, 2016 (Act 921).

PARTICULARS OF OFFENCE

AMMISHADDAI OWUSU-AMOAH, 64 years, in your position as the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority – in October 2023 – at Accra in the Greater Accra Region of the Republic of Ghana and within the jurisdiction of this Court, entered into an agreement on behalf of the Government of Ghana through Ghana Revenue Authority for consolidation of revenue assurance services with a financial commitment that binds the Government for more than one financial year to the benefit of Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited for a period of an initial five(5) years at a service fee of US\$0.75 per barrel of petroleum products per month and 0.75% of the total volume value of mineral resources monitored by Strategic Mobilisation Ghana Limited totaling an estimated Two Billion Seven Hundred and Ninety-Nine Million Six Hundred and Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Four United States Dollars Seventy-One Cents (US\$2,799,604,864.71) without the mandatory statutory prior authorisation by Parliament.

FACTS TO BE ESTABLISHED

The First Accused Person was the Minister of Finance at all material times in relation to him.

The Second Accused Person was the *Chef de Cabinet* of the First Accused Person in his capacity as the Minister of Finance at all material times in relation to him.

The Third Accused Person was the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority at all material times in relation to him.

The Fourth Accused Person was the Commissioner-General of Ghana Revenue Authority at all material times in relation to him.

The Fifth Accused Person was the Commissioner of the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority at all material times in relation to him.

The Sixth Accused Person was the Commissioner of the Customs Division of Ghana Revenue Authority at all material times in relation to him.

The Seventh Accused Person is the Chief Executive, beneficial owner, and controlling mind of the Eighth Accused Company.

The Eighth Accused Company is a company registered in Ghana (formerly known as Strategic Mobilisation Enhancement Limited).

The Accused Persons conspired to set up and did perform acts in furtherance of the conspiracy to set up a criminal enterprise of directly and indirectly influencing the procurement process to obtain unfair advantage for the Eighth Accused Company in the award of procurement contracts for transaction audit services, external price verification services, measurement audit of downstream petroleum products, upstream petroleum audit services, and minerals audit services purportedly by the Government of Ghana, acting through the Ministry of Finance and Ghana Revenue Authority.

The criminal enterprise was commenced in 2017 by the First, Third, Seventh, and Eighth Accused Persons, with the other Accused Persons joining the adventure at various times. The criminal enterprise was characterised by no genuine need for contracting the Eighth Accused Company for the obligations it purported to perform, and the contracts were secured for the Eighth Company through self-serving patronage,



sponsorship, and promotion by the First, Second, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Accused Persons based on false and unverified claims.

Also, the contracts were attended by the commission of egregious prohibited acts as mandatory statutory prior approvals by Parliament, and the Board of Public Procurement Authority were wantonly disregarded by the First, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Accused Persons who acted with increased emboldened impunity as they freely abused their public offices by using the offices for private benefit.

Further, the First, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Accused Persons ensured that there was no established financial management system of monitoring and verification to assure that the Republic was obtaining the value for the money it was paying to the Eighth Accused Company, and the channels of payments of public funds to the Eighth Accused Company were set on automatic mode by the First, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Accused Persons detached from actual performance and based on false and unverified claims in wilful oppressive injury to the public.

The actions of the First, Third, Fourth, Fifth, and Sixth Accused Persons created the opportunity for the Eighth Accused Company to largely pretend to perform the services under the various contracts – leading to immense financial loss to the Republic of about One Billion Four Hundred and Thirty-Six Million Two Hundred and Forty-Nine Thousand Eight Hundred and Twenty-Eight Cedis Fifty-Three Pesewas (GHC1,436,249,828.53).

And had they not been halted by the actions of three petitioners who lodged a complaint with the Office of the Special Prosecutor in December 2023 against the criminal enterprise; corruption and corruption-related investigations conducted by the Office of the Special Prosecutor between 20 December 2023 and 3 October 2025; Government intervention of temporarily suspending performance of the purported services in early January 2024; and a directive by the President of the Republic on 31 October 2025 for the termination of all the public contracts awarded to the Eighth Accused Company by the Ministry of Finance and Ghana Revenue Authority – the Accused Persons also intended that a further estimated Two Billion Seven Hundred and Ninety-Nine Million Six Hundred and Four Thousand Eight Hundred and Sixty-Four United States Dollars Seventy-One Cents (US\$2,799,604,864.71) be paid to the Eighth Accused Company for a period of five(5) years without the mandatory statutory prior authorisation by Parliament.



The Accused Persons based their actions on their false claims that the Eighth Accused Company possessed technical expertise and capability in revenue assurance, and that the technical expertise and capability of the Eighth Accused Person had greatly increased revenue for the Republic; and further that the Eighth Accused Company exclusively possessed the only patented and proven technology systems in the world for value chain transaction audits, external price verification, and measurement audit services in the downstream petroleum, upstream petroleum, and minerals sectors.

Based on the above, the Accused Persons have been charged with the offences contained in the charge sheet.
