SP Calls for Constitutional Backing

at CDD-Ghana Dialogue

At a CDD-Ghana National Dialogue on the OSP, Special Prosecutor Kissi Agyebeng renewed calls for constitutional backing to safeguard the Office's independence and strengthen Ghana's fight against corruption, while highlighting strong public confidence in the OSP.

Referencing a reflection paper by CDD-Ghana, he noted that over 70 per cent of Ghanaians support an independent anti-corruption body, while more than half consider the OSP the most trusted institution to tackle corruption.

He emphasised the need to entrench the OSP in the Constitution to ensure its continuity and effectiveness, beyond individual officeholders.

The SP also commended civil society organisations for their critical role in sustaining the OSP and urged stakeholders to intensify advocacy efforts—especially within the ongoing constitutional review process—to secure the Office's long-term future.
